**1. Welcome and Opening Remarks**

**Dr. K. D. Ladva**, Chairman of Academic Council, welcomed the august body.

The Chairperson, **Dr. K. D. Ladva**, on the behalf of all the AC members paid homage to the departed soul of **Mr. H. L. Pandya** (former AC member and Chairman BoS in English) and showed gratitude towards his services as Academic Counsel Member and Chairman of BoS in English, rendered from **May 2016 to November 2017**.

The Chairperson also introduced **Ms. Shivangi Oza** (newly appointed Chairman - BoS in English from November 2017) as new member inducted into the Academic Council.

The Chairperson, **Dr. K. D. Ladva** happily informed the august body about establishment of '**Atmiya University**' (a Gujarat State Private University) under the aegis of forerunner Trust of Shree Manibhai Virani & Smt. Navalben Virani Science College (MNVSC), the Sarvodaya Kelavani Samaj by the Government of Gujarat. Dr. Ladva informed the august body that as per the LoI response letter communicated to Government of Gujarat, the Trust had showed its willingness to include all the Higher Educational Institute (including MNVSC maintaining status quo for Grant in Aid conditions), working under the realms of Sarvodaya Kelavani Samaj, be included under the Atmiya University. So far the Government has given consent to hold the reins of all the Self Financed HEI affiliated to GTU/SU, under the flagship of Atmiya University and the decision for Shree Manibhai Virani & Smt. Navalben Virani Science College (MNVSC) is still under consideration.



**Dr. Ladva** emphasized that constant improving of education quality is one of the most significant tasks of any contemporary Higher Educational Institute. HEI is an integrated organization surrounded by a larger number of various stakeholders and the students are the most important stakeholder group on the campus. Primary objective of any HEI is to provide an amicable “ecosystem” to this student stakeholder group and, therefore their internal connections and expectations are of immense importance. Keeping these things in mind, the IQAC of the College organized a student workshop on "**Restructuring PG Curriculum**" from 16<sup>th</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup> **February, 2018**. During the workshop, many novel ideas were presented by the P.G. students of college for improvement in existing curriculum of PG programmes. The presentations were assessed and the recommendations were compiled by experts from outside the campus. These recommendations were circulated to the chairpersons of all the BoS to put in their BoS meeting for discussion and to search for the feasibilities of adoption of these recommendations

The Chairperson, **Dr. K.D. Ladva** then took up the agenda point by point.

#### *Agenda 2: Confirmation of Minutes of Third Meeting of Academic Council held on 21/06/2017*

**Dr. K. D. Ladva** informed that the third meeting of Academic Council was held on 21/06/2017 and Minutes were circulated on 25/06/2017.

As per the Minutes of the above meeting, the members had authorized the Chairman of AC to conduct entrance examination for admission to various UG programmes (Agenda No. 6 of 3<sup>rd</sup> Academic Council Meet). However, on discussion at various meetings of statutory & non-statutory bodies, it was deferred to conduct the entrance examination for the academic year 2017-18. Also, looking towards the wide scope and applications of the programme *i.e.*, "B.Sc. Food Processing & Preservation Technology", the nomenclature should be changed to "B.Sc. Food Processing Technology & Management".

2.1 **Dr. Ladva** indicated that in third AC meet (held on 21/06/2017) the members had authorized the Chairman to introduce three new programmes from the A.Y. 2017-18 (Agenda No. 3).

2.1.1 B.Sc. Electronics

2.1.2 B.Sc. Food Processing & Preservation Technology

2.1.3 M.Sc. Biochemistry



However, no admissions were done for the above programs on directions of the Trust who had certain other developmental plans, as minuted in GB decisions (in circulation) dated 10/07/2017.

## 2.2 Conversion of Allied courses to Core Courses under CBCS.

As per clause 7.0 of the above minutes dated 25/06/2017 of the third meeting of Academic Council, the Chairman of AC, with the approval of the Governing Body (minutes dated 25/09/2017) puts forth the following to this august body.

Accordingly, students were admitted in the above two groups during A.Y. 2017-18 and on completion of their 3 year programme, will be awarded the respective degrees as indicated above.

Subsequently, the college received a letter from Saurashtra University (Letter No. Jodan/9/295/2018 dated 09/05/2018) indicating that no additional seats beyond 120 in each of the groups would be sanctioned. Also that the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of these core courses would be self-financed (Letter No. Jodan/2/1287/2017 dated 09/11/2017). Hence, on advice of the Governing body of managing Trust (minutes dated 23/05/2018), no admission to the above were done from A.Y. 2018-19 & onwards.

The above was **approved** by the members and seconded by **Dr. S. J. Shah**.

No other comments were received from the honorable members regarding any other aspects, hence, the Minutes of Third AC meeting were taken as **confirmed**.

The above was **approved** by the members and seconded by **Dr. S.K. Vaidya**.

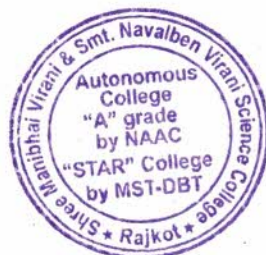
### *Agenda 3: Revised/New Regulations/Schemes of Instruction & Examinations and/or Syllabi framed by certain BoS*

**Dr. K. D. Ladva** moved the resolutions 3.11.1.1 to 3.11.1.6 and 3.11.2.1 to 3.11.2.3 as indicated in the Notes.

**Dr. Sheela Ramachandran** inquired about revision of syllabus and evaluation norms in Part III, SEC-I. Particularly she put in for the reason why there is the difference in syllabus and evaluation norms of Value Education Course for the students admitted in A.Y. 2017-18 and 2018-19.

Dr. Ladva explained that syllabus for value education has been framed and passed by ID-BoS for the students admitted from AY 2017-18. Since the Virani Science College is a center for Universal Human Values for Conscious Development and regularly organizing workshop and meetings in which the expert from outside the campus are invited for deliberations and giving suggestion. In one of such meeting Shri Somdev Tyagiji (Abhuday Sansthaan, Haapur) who has a very long experience of teaching Value Education, suggested that for the first year students of various UG & PG Programmes (Semester I and Semester II students), only activity based content should be delivered and only from 2<sup>nd</sup> year onwards the Text Book should be introduced in the syllabus. Accordingly a meeting of faculty members was organized in which modifications in the existing syllabus was proposed which was put in the BoS for consideration and passed for the students admitted from A.Y. 2018-19 and onwards.

Further **Dr. Sheela Ramachandran** asked about feedback regarding all the AECC and SEC courses; as these courses are introduced for the first time under autonomy.

**Dr. Ladva** revealed his explications that these courses were well received by the students and praised by all the stakeholders of the Shree Manibhai Virani & Smt. Navalben Virani Science College (MNVSC). Moreover, MNVSC is offering a total of 21 Value Added Courses (40 Hrs) and 19 Co-curricular courses (80 - 200 Hrs) so the students are getting enough choices to select the course from a basket.





Regarding Value Education **Dr. Ladva** added that it is an inexcusable fact that superlative purpose of education, which is enlightenment of human intellect and holistic development of human being, has totally been ignored in the current educational system. More sadly, in the chase of degree oriented education we have failed to add in morals and ethical values to our curriculum which is essentially required for the positive nourishment of character. More precisely, as the outcome of education, we are producing successful professionals who are infatuated with physical facilities. Keeping these things in mind Value Education course was designed and offered as Part III, SEC course, which is also in line with the vision and mission of MNVSC. Opposite to our perplexities the course was highly appreciated by the students and very positive changes has been observed in the students.

Regarding Communication skills and Soft Skills courses, **Ms. Shivangi Oza** told that students has shown high interest and enthusiasm in these courses. These course are mostly activity based so several activities/games/puzzles, like Treasure hunt, scrabble word finder, translations of Hindi songs to English etc have been designed to improve the communication abilities in the students. Active participation and enhancement of communication abilities were observed.

**Dr. Sheela Ramachandran** inquired that since these activities are organized outside the classroom, so how the attendance and participations is ensured?

Ms. Shivangi Oza explained that the course was conducted in small groups so it is easy to ensure full participation. Moreover the student's attendance was very motivating and the students have participated in all activities with lot of enthusiasm.

**Dr. Ladva** proudly shared that syllabus and scheme of AECC courses (*i.e.* Functional English I & II) of MNVSC has similar contents for the same courses of finishing school programmes, initiated by Knowledge Consortium of Gujarat (KCG), Government of Gujarat. Further **Dr. Ladva** also proudly informed that 30 students of Biochemistry Department registered for online courses of NPTEL, successfully completed the same and earned extra credits for their programmes.

The above were approved by the members and seconded by **Dr. Sheela Ramachandran**.

The Chairman informed that the examinations of all the programs of the autonomous college have been conducted and results of every semester were declared within 21 days of last examination.

The Chairman also told that the first batch of students of P.G. programs have successfully passed out from the autonomous college, and e-governance of CoE Office has also accelerated the process of sending the results to Saurashtra University for early issue of provisional certificates and for their degrees.

He also shared his observation that there has not been any typographical/markings system/out of syllabus types of grievances in question papers or any case of unfair conduct by the students during the examinations by University/Local Flying Squad which is common and often seen in many HEIs.

Dr. Sheela Ramachandran also congratulated Controller of Examination Dr. S. J. Shah for timely completion of task without any faux pas. She also put on record special appreciation of Mr. H. N. Donga (Dy. Controller of Examination) for his untiring efforts and hard work for maintaining the software and feeding of data for timely completion of job.

Dr. Neepa Pandhi also proudly shared her experience regarding novel practice of Answer Sheet checking and evaluation at MNVSC, i.e. 'Moderation of Answer Sheet by different examiners', was very much appreciated by the Examination Section of parent University and they also have adopted the same method of evaluation at their place.

### **Agenda 8: Admissions to certain programmes in A.Y. 2018-2019**

**Dr. K. D. Ladva**, Chairman of Academic Council informed the members that as per Gujarat State Government notification dated 13/04/2018, vide no. GH/SH/ 9/EPU/2017/241/Kh1, the **Atmiya University** has been established at Rajkot *w.e.f.* **13/04/2018**. He further added that 'Sarvodaya Kelavani Samaj' the founder Trust established under the Gujarat Public Trust Act, 1950, is the sponsoring body of the Atmiya University.

Accordingly, the Dy. Secretary, Education Department, Gandhinagar, in its letter dated 06/06/2018, vide no. EPU/2017/241/Kh1 has included all the Self Financed HEIs, except Shree Manibhai Virani and Smt. Navalben Virani Science College (Autonomous) under Atmiya University. The letter states that inclusion of Shree Manibhai Virani and Smt. Navalben Virani Science College (Autonomous) under Atmiya University is under consideration of the State Government. The Registrar, Saurashtra University, Rajkot and Registrar, Gujarat Technological University, Ahmedabad, have also been informed of the same.

Meanwhile, in anticipation of a positive decision, and to make the self-financed programmes more proactive, the Trust directed that admissions of all the UG & PG self-financed programmes of Shree Manibhai Virani and Smt. Navalben Virani Science College (Autonomous) be made under Atmiya University (minutes dated 27/04/2018). Subsequent minutes dated 05/07/2018 of Trust meeting, transferred all the SF- UG & PG programmes to Atmiya University.

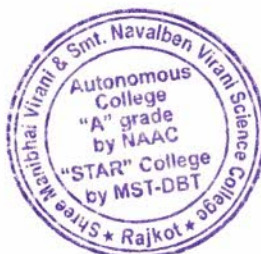

**Dr. Ladva** proposed that the college has not received any funds from UGC for B.Voc programme beyond the 1<sup>st</sup> installment. Similarly the M.Sc. POC programme was started under UGC's Innovative Assistant Program in 2012, for which the tenure was of 5 years. Moreover the Trust have some other developmental plans to implement instead of continuing M.Sc. POC programme.

Hence, the Trust had decided that in view of the above, admission to the above B.Voc. programmes & M.Sc. Pharma. Organic Chemistry (POC) Programme **be not made** for **A.Y. 2018-2019**.

However, the students of the above programmes admitted in A.Y. 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 would continue their course of study until completion under the autonomous college.

**Dr. K. D. Ladva**, Chairperson of the Academic Council, moved the resolution **8.1 to 8.3** and the same was **approved** by the members and seconded by **Prof. S. K. Vaidya**.
